"What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone claims to have faith but does not have works? Surely that faith cannot save, can it? If a brother or sister is naked and lacks daily food and one of you says to them, 'Go in peace; keep warm and eat your fill,' and yet you do not supply their bodily needs, what is the good of that? So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead. But someone will say, 'You have faith, and I have works.' Show me your faith apart from works, and I by my works will show you my faith." James 2: v14-18

In this passage, James states the basis of the fourth tenet of our mission: **acting on our faith by serving in our world.** His message is not confined to a specific community dealing with a specific issue (as is Paul's message in Galatians 2) but applies to all believers in all times. James is concerned with a faith that is revealed by works which aid those less fortunate than us.

In May of this past spring, Jenny Prileson and several LCC volunteers led a fundraising event to support the people in wartorn Ukraine, raising over \$5,600. We acted upon our faith and worked together, contributing our talents and our money to an important cause. The success of this fundraising effort has us planning how we can act again in the future to aid others in need somewhere in the world.

We continue to serve the world in many other ways. Last fall, we co-sponsored a wonderful dinner where 1/3 of the proceeds were used to support a school in Laos. And closer to home, we hold an annual CROP Walk, led by Bill and Abbe Murphy, to help feed the hungry. Here in Lyme, we sponsor SouperCare, host the CCL food pantry, Happy Feet and VegiCare services, and support an active Parish Nurse program. These are just some of the works we perform in support of our faith.

Let us thank God that we continue to find ways to serve in the world by acting upon our deep faith, working to serve the needy, wherever those needs may be found.
